

Rawson Cup Results 2006

- **Swimming:** The swimming was won by St Andrew's, with St Paul's second and Wesley College third.

- **Rowing:** St Paul's, with two rowers recently selected for national squads, was victorious in the rowing for the seventh consecutive year. Particular mention should be made of the fine contribution of Andrew Wilson, who has been a member of the crew for the past five years.

- **Rugby:** The first match was played on Monday 22 May. St Paul's defeated St John's convincingly 24-nil after no scoring in the first twenty minutes. On Tuesday 30 May Paul's defeated Wesley 25-nil after being 20-nil at half time. In the final, St Andrew's defeated St Paul's 18-13.

- **Soccer:** St Paul's snatched victory from Andrew's in a penalty shoot-out in the first match. The final shot at goal was taken by Drew Tarrant (goal keeper) and was successful. Wesley defeated St John's 2-1. In the second round, St John's defeated Paul's 2-nil; Wesley vs Drew's 2-1. In the final round John's d Drew's 2-nil and Paul's d Wesley 1-0. St John's and Wesley shared first place in the competition, with Paul's third (due to the fact that one of the Paul's victories was in a penalty shoot-out).

- **Tennis:** St Andrew's were deserving winners of the tennis this year. St Paul's came a respectable second, with Wesley in third place. The team consisted of Nick Burke, Andrew McKillop and Ivan Tarjan, with the new impact players of Charlie Boyle, Andrew Fairbairn, Richard Cahill and Alec Brown.
