Associate Dean of Graduate House

St Paul's College is a residential academic community for students of the **University of Sydney**, located at the centre of the University's main campus.

Today, St Paul's College aspires to be a modern, internationally-minded, outward-looking Australian Anglican college at the heart of the University of Sydney: a place where students, academic staff and visitors – reflecting the full spectrum of university life – interact, grow and learn from one another in a mutually supportive residential academic environment.

In 2018, the College has entered a new era under the leadership of [Dr Donald Markwell](#), the former global head of the Rhodes Scholarships, as Head of College. It is building upon its distinguished heritage by creating a distinctive new '[Graduate House](#)' community for postgraduate students and academics, both women and men, from Australia and around the world, under the leadership of the Dean of Graduate House, [Dr Antone Martinho-Truswell](#), a fellow of Magdalen College, Oxford. The resulting larger College will be a vibrant, continually relevant community, shaping for good the lives of its members, the University, and the society of tomorrow.

The Graduate House community for 140 women and men postgraduate students and academics, is scheduled to open in January 2019 and applications are now invited for the position of **Associate Dean of Graduate House**.



The Associate Dean will be appointed from early 2019 to support the Dean in the creation of this world-class collegiate community for postgraduate students and academics at the heart of the University, both in physical location and human endeavour.

The Associate Dean will have a particular focus on student welfare and pastoral support. This is expected to include both being a presence within Graduate House, available to graduate students for advice and support, and the convening of a peer support program. Support for students will include academic and broader mentoring. The Associate Dean will further assist the Dean in managing the recruitment, interviewing, and enrolment of students, and building and sustaining a rich, scholarly culture in Graduate House and across the College as a whole.

The Associate Dean will report to the Dean and will strongly support the College's values, purpose and faith tradition. The Associate Dean will uphold the College's commitment to be leaders in fighting sexism, and to respect and dignity for all, regardless of gender.

This is an outstanding opportunity for candidates with strong academic credentials and a demonstrable capacity to nurture young people through higher education. Excellent interpersonal, public speaking and communication skills, with sensitivity to individuals and their aspirations, are as important as the ability to provide effective support across academic and extra-curricular activities.

It is anticipated that candidates will have a strong knowledge of university life. The role is part-time and expected to occupy several evening and weekend hours each week and is intended to be combined with a full-time academic post, most probably at the University of Sydney. In general, hours will be highly flexible, with some mandatory obligations. The position is non-stipendiary; remuneration is in the form of accommodation and meals. Accommodation will include a new superior apartment within the Graduate House building (from January 2019), fully furnished, and including all utilities, wifi, cleaning, and linen service. Accommodation is suitable for couples and may be suitable for small children. All meals may be taken free of charge in College dining halls during semesters and the winter break.

Graduate House is a co-educational residential community.
